

Uomo Del Labirinto

I Labirinti di Emilio Villa costituiscono un materiale autografo di fogli sparsi inediti, a carattere poetico e non, appartenente per lo più alla sua produzione dei primi anni Ottanta del secolo scorso. In questa proposta editoriale ne viene pubblicata e analizzata per la prima volta una selezione che rappresenta un possibile percorso offerto dall'autrice, all'interno di questo corpus, in grado di evidenziare un filone portante dell'approccio villiano al tema.

L'approfondimento di questo versante dell'opera di Villa si allarga alla sua intera attività seguendone le tracce sia biografiche che attraverso la ricognizione della sua intera produzione testuale. A questo si riallaccia un'analisi dei temi di fondo della sua poetica, fino a delineare una ipotesi di un'origine della parola nella chiave di un divenire di cui Villa si qualifica a suo modo come profeta, anticipatore di un eschaton in grado di riconnettersi all'arché.

Yoshiharu Tsuge is one of comics' most celebrated and influential artists, but his work has been almost entirely unavailable to English-speaking audiences. *The Man Without Talent*, his first book ever to be translated into English, is an unforgiving self-portrait of frustration. Swearing off cartooning as a profession, Tsuge takes on a series of unconventional jobs -- used camera salesman, ferryman, and stone

collector -- hoping to find success among the hucksters, speculators, and deadbeats he does business with. Instead, he fails again and again, unable to provide for his family, earning only their contempt and his own. The result is a dryly funny look at the pitfalls of the creative life, and an off-kilter portrait of modern Japan. Accompanied by an essay from translator Ryan Holmberg that discusses Tsuge's importance in comics and Japanese literature, *The Man Without Talent* is one of the great works of comics literature.

Ma uno scopo c'è: risolvere un ultimo mistero. La scomparsa di Samantha Andretti è un suo vecchio caso, un incarico che Bruno non ha mai portato a termine... E questa è l'occasione di rimediare. Nonostante sia trascorso tanto tempo. Perché quello che Samantha non sa è che il suo rapimento non è avvenuto pochi mesi prima, come lei crede. He explains that her name is Samantha, that she has been kidnapped and kept prisoner, but managed to escape, and that his job is to find her kidnapper. However, the hunt will not take place in the outside world, but in Samantha's mind. White reveals to Samantha that she is no longer thirteen, but twenty-eight. In other words, she was held prisoner for fifteen years. With his help, she gradually starts to recall certain episodes from her captivity. In a city overcome by a ferocious heatwave, where the people have taken to sleeping during the day, and leaving their homes only at night, a private detective called Bruno, who has spent years investigating Samantha's disappearance, learns of her liberation. Now, stricken with a heart disease, the detective has only two months to live, but nonetheless, he takes up the hunt once more.

Tom Willock's first book, *Green River Rising*, earned the kind of reviews that are rarely accorded to most so-called literary thrillers. This remarkable debut was hailed for its rich, powerful writing as well as its dramatic, page-turning suspense. The *New York Times Book Review* called it "beautifully vivid" and "triumphantly realized," while *People* called it "as fine a thriller as one could ask for." The author's much-anticipated second novel is as powerful and ambitious as its predecessor. Set in New Orleans and the rural South, it is the story of a chain of cataclysmic events let loose by the murder of Clarence Jefferson, a legendary lawman who has gathered a cache of evidence that could imprison corrupt politicians in five states. His last act, it appears, was to handpick two people as the unlucky heirs of his potentially explosive evidence files. Though both have burdens enough of their own, they are swept up into this story of Southern violence, passion, and vengeance, the likes of which perhaps only the readers of Willock's previous novel can imagine. Compared by critics to Norman

Mailer, James Ellroy, Stephen Hunter, and Andrew Vachss, Willocks offers a unique amalgam of gritty realism and something more—a depth and intensity that is seldom achieved in popular fiction.

A grieving young widow, seeking answers to her husband's death, becomes entangled in an investigation steeped in the darkest mysteries of Rome. Sandra Vega, a forensic analyst with the Roman police department, mourns deeply for a marriage that ended too soon. A few months ago, in the dead of night, her husband, an up-and-coming journalist, plunged to his death at the top of a high-rise construction site. The police ruled it an accident. Sanda is convinced it was anything but. Launching her own inquiries, Sanda finds herself on a dangerous trail, working the same case that she is convinced led to her husband's murder. An investigation which is deeply entwined with a series of disappearances that has swept the city, and brings Sandra ever closer to a centuries-old secret society that will do anything to stay in the shadows.

A diplomat who successfully negotiated with intelligent aliens finds his loyalty to the human race tested in this novel by a Nebula Award-winning author. Richard Muller was an honorable diplomat who braved unimaginable dangers to make contact with the first-known race of intelligent aliens. But those aliens left a mark on him: a psychic wound that emanates a telepathic miasma his fellow humans can neither cure nor endure. Muller is exiled to the remote planet of Lemnos, where he is left, deeply embittered, at the heart of a deadly maze . . . until a new alien race appears, seemingly intent on exterminating humanity. Only Muller can communicate with them, due to the very condition that has

made him an outcast. But will Muller stick his neck out for the people who so callously rejected him?

In the time of Vespasian, just after Rome has crushed the Jewish Revolt, Julius Varro, a Roman Questor (an investigating magistrate) is commissioned to investigate the story that a Jew rose from the dead after being crucified in Jerusalem. Because the fast-growing Nazarene sect founded by the martyr's followers is becoming a threat to the stability of the region, there is much riding on debunking the story. Questor Varro has to deal with the evidence that goes back forty years, with most witnesses long dead and the living ones lying to protect themselves. But he is intent on producing a report that will demolish the claims of these religious fanatics. His investigation stirs intrigue, religious passion, and violence, to say nothing of an attraction to a beautiful Jewish slave girl. Questor Varro's report methodically destroys the myth fueling the newborn Christian movement. But then an extraordinary event occurs that changes everything.

La diagnosi dell'uomo moderno e delle sue molteplici crisi è spesso spietata. Tuttavia nessuno ha parlato con maggiore autorità e

competenza come il Pontefice Pio XII. E nella sua parola sfolgorante di verità e di vita, palpita la tenerezza paterna nello scoprire le piaghe sanguinanti dei figli, la sollecitudine pastorale nell'additare la causa e la vera radice del male, la fermezza apostolica nel prescrivere coraggiosamente l'unico efficace rimedio.

In Carlotto's *The Campagna Trail*, Inspector Campagna uses an old friendship with notorious drug dealer Roby Pizzo in a Machiavellian attempt to keep the peace. But when an interfering new police chief demands Campagna bring down the Mafioso who heads Pizzo's gang, Campagna must use every weapon he has to save his job - and his life.

Meanwhile in Carofiglio's *The Speed of the Angel*, a writer in crisis strikes up an unlikely friendship with a mysterious woman he meets in a quiet seaside café. As the pursuit accelerates through back streets and skyscrapers, it becomes clear that there is more to organised crime than getting your hands dirty.
